**Opinion**

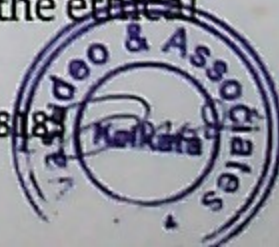
We have audited the accompanying Standalone Statement of Financial Results of **SHRADHA PROJECTS LIMITED** ('the Company') for the Quarter ended 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2020 and the year to date results for the period 1<sup>st</sup> April, 2019 to 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2020, attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the Statement:

- A. is presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended; and
- B. gives a true and fair view in conformity with applicable Indian Accounting standards prescribed under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the act") read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the net profit and total comprehensive income and other financial information of the Company for the year ended March 31, 2020.

**Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards of Auditing ("SAs") specified section 143(10) of the Act. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the Standalone Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the code of ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India ("ICAI") together with the ethical





requirements that are relevant to our audit of the Standalone Financial Statements under the provisions of the Act and the rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion on the Standalone Financial Results.

**Emphasis of Matter**

We draw attention to Note 5 of the Standalone Financial Results, as regards the management's evaluation of COVID-19 impact on the future performance of the Company. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

**Management's responsibility for the Standalone Financial Statements**

The statement has been prepared on the basis of the annual Standalone Financial Statements. The Company's board of directors are responsible for the matters stated in section 134 (5) of the Act with respect to the preparation of these Standalone Financial Statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance and cash flows of the Company in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the accounting standards specified under section 133 of the Act, read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in compliance with Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations, as amended.

This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statement that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the Standalone Financial Statements, management is responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The board of directors are also responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process of the Company.



**Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the Standalone Financial Statements**

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the Standalone Financial Statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these Standalone Financial Results.

As part of an audit in accordance with SAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the Standalone Financial Statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.

Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Company to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the Standalone Financial Statements, including the disclosures, and whether the Standalone Financial Statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation

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## Notes :-

- 1 The above Standalone Financial Results which are published in accordance with the regulation 33 of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligation & Disclosure Requirement) Regulations, 2015 have been reviewed and recommended by Audit Committee and has been approved by the Board of Directors at its Meeting held on Friday July 31, 2020. The Financial Results are accordance with Indian Accounting Standard (Ind-AS) as prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 3 of Companies (Indian Accounting Standard) Rules, 2015 and Companies (Indian Accounting Standard) Rules, 2016, The Result have been audited by the Statutory Auditors of the Company.
- 2 The Company has adopted Indian Accounting Standard ("IND AS") effective from 1st April 2019 (Transition date being 1st April 2018) and accordingly the Financial Results for the Quarter / year ended 31st March, 2020 have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in Ind AS prescribed under section 133 of the Companies Act' 2013. ("the act") read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other relevant provisions of the act. The Impact of transition to Ind AS has been accounted for in the Other Comprehensive Income and Comparative Previous year figures have been restated accordingly
- 3 **Fair valuation of Financial Instruments:** Company has valued certain financial asset at fair value. The impact of change in fair value as on the date of transaction (i.e. 01/04/2018) is recognised in opening equity and the changes thereafter in the Statement of Profit and Loss or other Comprehensive Income as the case may be.
- 4 The figures for the 3 Months ended on March 31, 2020 are the balancing figures between the audited figures in respect of full financial year and published unaudited year to date figures upto the 9 Months of the respective financial year. which were subjected to Limited Review Report by the Auditors.
- 5 The spread of SARS-COV-2 virus (referred as 'COVID-19') across the global and in India has contributed to a significant decline and volatility in global and Indian financial markets and a contraction in the economic activities. On March 11, 2020 COVID-19 outbreak was declared as a global pandemic by the World Health Organisation. The Indian Government announced a strict 21 day lockdown on March 24, 2020 which is being extended from time to time with or without relaxations across the country based on the severity of the spread at local levels. The extent to which the COVID-19 pandemic will impact the operations and financial results of the Company and consequently the estimates and judgements made could vary on future developments, including among other things any new information concerning the severity of the COVID-19 pandemic and any action to contain its spread or mitigate its impact whether government mandated or elected by the Company, which are uncertain as at the date approval of these financial results. The Company continues to closely monitor any material changes to future economic conditions, which will be given effect in the respective future period. However, considering the overall condition of the economy and the interventions of the Government to ensure revival of economic activity, the company does not consider that there is any uncertainty regarding the assumption of going concern.
- 6 Previous Quarter figures have been regrouped / reclassified wherever necessary, to make them comparable.
